STATE AND NATIONAL SkillsUSA CONDUCT CODE

A good reputation enables members to take pride in their organization. SkillsUSA members have an excellent reputation. Your conduct at any SkillsUSA function should make a positive contribution to the reputation that has been established.

- 1. Your behavior at all times should be such that it reflects credit to you, your school/college, your state, and SkillsUSA.
- 2. Student conduct is the responsibility of the local chapter advisor. Students shall keep their advisors informed of their activities and whereabouts at all time. (SkillsUSA conference name badges shall be worn at all times.)
- 3. You are expected to attend all general sessions and other scheduled conference activities. Please be prompt and show respect to those in the audience and on stage.
- 4. Members are to report any accidents, injuries, or illnesses to their local or state advisor immediately.
- 5. Official attire is strongly recommended! However if official attire is not available business like attire is expected. Including the dance there is to be NO JEANS, TEE SHIRTS, SNEAKERS OR COMBAT FATIGUES.
- 6. If a student is responsible for stealing or vandalism, the student and his/her parents will be expected to pay any and all damages.
- 7. Members/participants attending any SkillsUSA activities, including District, State, or National Conferences may **not** purchase, consume, or be under the influence of alcohol or drugs at any time. Violators will be subject to Stringent disciplinary action.
- 8. Students who disregard the rules will be subject to disciplinary action and will be sent home at their own expense. Parents will be notified. Earned medals should be returned to the association.
- 9. Members are to abide by the State and National SkillsUSA Attire Policy at all business sessions, General sessions, competitive events, and other conference activities.
